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- B. In exchange for the Project's promise contained in sub-paragraph "A" above, the Establishment agrees to abide by the following rules and regulations:
- 1) Handle, process, and/or move regulated articles in accordance with the European Grapevine Moth quarantine requirements;
 - 2) Follow the Project's instructions regarding the use of all European Grapevine Moth permits and certificates;
 - 3) Maintain and make such records as the Project requires accessible for inspection upon reasonable notice by the Project Officer. These records shall be maintained for a period of the later of 2 years or the resolution of any outstanding claims.
- C. This agreement becomes effective on signing and shall remain in effect until canceled by either party on 30 days notice to the other at the address of either appearing above. However, the Project may accelerate the notice to immediate for cause, including but not limited to the Establishment's abandonment of the procedures outlined in the attached Exhibit(s).
- D. Establishment assumes liability, if any, arising from the manner in which Establishment sells, handles or distributes any regulated host material.

NOTICE: Any signatory or employee of any signatory who violates the terms of this Compliance Agreement may be subject to Civil Penalties pursuant to California Food and Agricultural Code Section 5705.

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EXHIBIT H1- HAULER/TRANSPORTER

Provisions for Regulated Fruit Other Than Grapes and Olives
Hauled or Transported *Within* or *From* the State Interior Quarantine for EGVM


Establishment shall only move regulated articles *within or from* the area quarantined for EGVM when complying with *all* of the following:

1. EGVM host fruit originating inside the EGVM quarantine area shall only be transported from a grower* under compliance with the Project.
2. For shipments of fresh fruit destined for re-packing or processing, ensure a copy of the Certificate of Quarantine Compliance (CQC), issued to the grower at the time of inspection, accompanies each shipment of EGVM host fruit to an approved receiver*. Establishment must make a copy of CQC available upon request by EGVM Project.
3. Ensure a copy of the Certificate (Federal Shield) accompanies each shipment of fruit qualifying for interstate movement.
4. Provide a copy of the Certificate (Federal Shield) to the shipping/cooling/packing/receiving facility.
5. *Intrastate* transport of *uninspected* or *untreated* fruit is not permitted under this compliance agreement.
6. Ensure that the exterior of all vehicles, conveyances and equipment (bins, barrels, machinery, gondolas, etc.) is thoroughly cleaned of all host material and debris prior to leaving the growing premises for transit and prior to leaving the receiving facility.
7. Ensure all employees receive training to be compliant with all specifications of this compliance agreement exhibit.
8. Ensure a copy of this compliance agreement and this exhibit are inside each vehicle during transit.
9. **Shipments of fresh fruit subject to treatment must be:**
 - a) Received by an approved treatment facility* under compliance with the Project and/or the receiving County Agricultural Commissioner, and
 - b) transported in completely enclosed vehicles/conveyances or fruit must be completely covered with screens or tarps to minimize spread of any life stages of EGVM during transit, and
 - c) transported in vehicles/conveyances that are thoroughly cleaned of all exterior EGVM host debris prior to leaving the growing premises for transit and prior to leaving the receiving facility, and
 - d) transported *IMMEDIATELY* from the growing premises to the authorized treatment facility* using a continuous direct route, without delay or interruption.
 - e) *In contiguous EGVM quarantine areas*, fruit may be transported in a manner approved by the Project, which prevents the loss of any portion of the load during transit.
10. Notify the Project as soon as possible, but no later than 24 hours, in the event of an accident or a spillage of EGVM host fruit destined for treatment.

EXHIBIT N1- GREEN WASTE TRANSPORTER/HAULER

Provisions for the Intrastate Movement of Green Waste Originating in the EGVM Quarantine Area

Establishment agrees to:

1. Vehicle and/or Trailer Requirements

Only transport green waste originating from the EGVM quarantine area in a vehicle or trailer that is in compliance with the California Vehicle Code sections 23114(a) and 23115(a).

- 23114. (a) A vehicle may not be driven or moved on any highway unless the vehicle is so constructed, covered, or loaded as to prevent any of its contents or load other than clear water or feathers from live birds from dropping, sifting, leaking, blowing, spilling, or otherwise escaping from the vehicle.
- 23115. (a) No vehicle transporting garbage, swill, used cans or bottles, wastepapers, waste cardboard, ashes, refuse, trash, or rubbish, or any noisome, nauseous, or offensive matter, or anything being transported for disposal or recycling shall be driven or moved upon any highway unless the load is totally covered in a manner that will prevent the load or any part of the load from spilling or falling from the vehicle.

2. Safeguarded Conveyance

Unless transported in a fully enclosed vehicle or trailer, only transport green waste within or out of the quarantine area in a vehicle or trailer covered in a manner, approved by the Project, to eliminate the loss of green waste while in transit.

3. Approved Receiver

Only move green waste to one of the following:

- a) City or county sanitary landfill within the EGVM quarantine area
- b) State licensed compost facility within the EGVM quarantine area
- c) A green waste receiver under EGVM compliance agreement

4. Shipping Documents and Quarantine Certification

- a) Ensure that quarantine certification accompanies each shipment moved within or from the quarantine area and
- b) Provide a copy of the bill of lading (or other shipping document) and quarantine certification to receiver

5. Trailer Cleaning

Ensure that the conveyance used to transport green waste is thoroughly cleaned of green waste debris after unloading and prior to leaving the approved receiving facility.

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EXHIBIT U1- HAULER/TRANSPORTER: FRESH GRAPES

Provisions for Intrastate and Interstate Movement of Fresh Grapes Grown Inside the EGVM Quarantine Area

Establishment shall only move regulated articles *within or from* the area quarantined for EGVM when complying with *all* of the following:

1. Fresh grapes originating inside the EGVM quarantine area shall only be transported from a grower* under compliance with the Project.
2. Shipments of fresh grapes destined for re-packing or processing, must be accompanied by a copy of the Certificate of Quarantine Compliance (CQC), issued to the grower at the time of inspection, and must be delivered to an approved receiver.* Establishment must make a copy of the CQC available upon request by the EGVM Project.
3. Ensure a copy of the Certificate (Federal Shield) accompanies each qualifying interstate shipment of fresh grapes.
4. Provide a copy of the Certificate (Federal Shield) to the shipping/cooling/packing/ receiving facility.
5. *Intrastate* transport of *uninspected* or *untreated* fresh grapes must be done under QC Permit 1269.
6. Ensure the exterior of all vehicles, conveyances and equipment (bins, barrels, machinery, gondolas, etc.) is thoroughly cleaned of all host material and debris prior to leaving the growing premises for transit and prior to leaving the receiving facility.
7. Ensure all employees receive training to be compliant with all specifications of this compliance agreement exhibit.
8. Ensure a copy of this compliance agreement and this exhibit are inside each vehicle during transit.
9. **Shipments of fresh grapes subject to treatment must be:**
 - a) Received by an approved treatment facility* under compliance with the Project and/or the receiving County Agricultural Commissioner, and
 - b) transported in completely enclosed vehicles/conveyances or fresh grapes must be completely covered with screens or tarps to minimize spread of any life stages of EGVM during transit, and
 - c) transported in vehicles/conveyances that are thoroughly cleaned of all exterior EGVM host debris prior to leaving the growing premises for transit and prior to leaving the receiving facility, and
 - d) transported **IMMEDIATELY** from the growing premises to the authorized treatment facility* using a continuous direct route, without delay or interruption.
 - e) *In contiguous EGVM quarantine areas*, fresh grapes may be transported in one of the following ways to prevent spillage during transit:
 - ii) tightly covered (i.e. tarped, screened, covered by stacked bins, etc.), or
 - iii) filled to 4 inches (for hand harvested grapes) or 12 inches (for machine harvested grapes) below the rim of the container if grapes have been harvested from a vineyard distanced 200 or more meters from a vineyard with an EGVM detection or where pre-harvest treatments for each generation of EGVM have been applied, or
 - iv) other as specified below (see specific instructions)
 10. Notify the Project as soon as possible, but no later than 24 hours, in the event of an accident or a spillage of fresh grapes destined for treatment.
